BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

"In the age of the automobile, Swainsboro, the [Emanuel] county seat, has been called the 'Crossroads of the South' for its location at the intersection of U.S. highways 1 and 80. In 1822 the state legislature named it 'Swainsborough' in recognition of Stephen Swain, the state senator who introduced the bill for the county's creation in 1812.
